

Operating Policy – MSU Teaching Awards

1. Criteria

- 1.1. The McMaster Students Union (MSU) shall grant MSU Teaching Awards in recognition of excellence among educators at McMaster University based on criteria, including, but not limited to:
 - 1.1.1. Organization of the material;
 - 1.1.2. Ability to communicate;
 - 1.1.3. Delivery of style;
 - 1.1.4. Flexibility;
 - 1.1.5. Accessibility;
 - 1.1.6. Approachability;
 - 1.1.7. Enthusiasm of instructor;
 - 1.1.8. Overall teaching ability;
 - 1.1.9. Knowledge of course material.
- 1.2. The Teaching Awards Committee (TAC) shall confer Academic Division Awards to one (1) instructor in each academic division who:
 - 1.2.1. Did not receive the award for the previous academic year;
 - 1.2.2. Rank among the top two (2) nominees per nomination period;
 - 1.2.2.1. The top nominees will be determined by the percentage of nominations cast from the registered students in the instructor's course with the discretion of the Coordinator:
 - 1.2.3. Received the highest average score of top nominees determined by the in-class evaluations.
- 1.3. The TAC may confer Lifetime Achievement Award(s) to one (1) instructor each year who:
 - 1.3.1. Has shown dedication to teaching at McMaster University for a minimum of ten (10) years;
 - 1.3.2. Is close to retirement:

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- 1.3.3. Have shown evidence in their application of contribution to McMaster Academia. Student Life, and community outside of McMaster:
- 1.3.4. Is selected by the TAC through a blinded review process of the applications.
- 1.4. The TAC may confer Teaching Merit Award(s) to up to two (2) instructors each year who:
 - 1.4.1. Are in their first or second year of teaching at McMaster University;
 - 1.4.2. Have shown evidence in their application of contribution and teaching abilities that have been significant, effective and worthy of distinction;
 - 1.4.3. Are selected by TAC through a blinded review process of the applications.
- 1.5. The TAC may confer Teaching Assistant Awards to up to two (2) Teaching or Instructional Assistants each year who:
 - 1.5.1. Rank among the top three (3) nominees per nomination period;
 - 1.5.1.1. The top nominees will be determined by the percentage of nominations cast from registered students in the instructor's course with the discretion of the Coordinator;
 - 1.5.2. Received the highest average score of the top nominees determined by the in-class evaluations.
- 1.6. The TAC may confer Pedagogical Innovation Award(s) to one (1) instructor who:
 - 1.6.1. Has shown innovation within their teaching or course design;
 - 1.6.2. Is one of the top four (4) nominees within their Faculty;
 - 1.6.3. Has been selected by the TAC, with the aid of the Vice-President (Education), through a blinded review process using comments received from the nomination and evaluation process.
- 1.7. The TAC may confer Community Engagement Award(s) to up to two (2) instructors each year who:
 - 1.7.1. Has shown dedication to community-engaged education at McMaster University;
 - 1.7.2. Has shown evidence in their application of contribution to the broader community;
 - 1.7.3. Are selected by TAC through a blinded review process of applications.

- 1.8. The TAC may confer Ontario Undergraduate Student Alliance (OUSA) Award for Teaching Excellence to one (1) instructor each year who:
 - 1.8.1. Has shown evidence of interesting students in learning the course materials and engage their students in learning and discovery;
 - 1.8.2. Has shown evidence of helping students develop thinking and learning skills;
 - 1.8.3. Is a close second place nominee for another award;
 - 1.8.4. Has a contractually limited appointment;
 - 1.8.5. Has been selected by the TAC, with the aid of the Vice-President (Education), through a blinded review process using comments received from the nomination and evaluation processes as well as curriculum vitae or teaching portfolio.

2. Selection Committee

- 2.1. The TAC shall be appointed annually at the first SRA meeting in November for the purpose of considering nominations for the MSU Teaching Awards;
- 2.2. Members of the TAC shall be:
 - 2.2.1. The Macademics Teaching Awards Coordinator, as Chair;
 - 2.2.2. The Macademics Coordinator;
 - 2.2.3. Three (3) SRA members;
 - 2.2.4. At least four (4) non-SRA MSU members, who shall:
 - 2.2.4.1. Support the TAC Coordinator in completing their responsibilities;
 - 2.2.4.2. Be selected by the SRA via election:
 - 2.2.4.3. Perform other duties as outlined in the Elected TAC Committee Member job description.
- 2.3. The total membership of the committee minus one (1) shall constitute quorum.

3. Procedures

- The TAC shall determine the award recipient(s) according to the criteria for granting the award;
 - 3.1.1. The TAC shall meet at least once monthly across the academic term:
 - 3.1.2. The TAC shall accept nominations for:
 - 3.1.2.1. Fall term courses no later than the second week of November;

- 3.1.2.2. Winter term courses no later than the second week of February;
- 3.1.3. The TAC shall host one (1) awards ceremony each semester to present the awards formally to recipients.
 - 3.1.3.1. Deliberations shall be held in closed session and the recipient(s) shall be determined by a two-thirds (2/3) affirmative vote;
 - 3.1.3.2. All nominees shall be invited to the awards presentation.
- 3.1.4. The TAC's decision shall not be disclosed to the public until the award is presented to the recipient(s).
 - 3.1.4.1. A news release honouring the award recipients shall be issued following the award's presentation.
- 3.2. The Chair of the TAC shall:
 - 3.2.1. Coordinate the activities of the TAC;
 - 3.2.2. Work with the Marketing & Communications Director to promote award nominations and arrange for the public announcement of award recipients over any media deemed appropriate;
 - 3.2.3. File a year-end report with the Executive Assistant in accordance with the records retention requirements set out in Operating Policy Awards & Distinctions, Section 5.
- 3.3. Vacancies on the TAC shall be filled by the body which elected/appointed the original member;
 - 3.3.1. Should the Macademics Teaching Awards Coordinator resign or be forced to relinquish their seat, the vacant seat shall be filled in the following order of priority:
 - 3.3.1.1. First, by the Macademics Coordinator; and
 - 3.3.1.2. Second, by an alternative Executive member of MSU Macademics.
