Yearplan Update

As the year is coming to an end, Spark is wrapping up with our mentorship programming and events. In February, we held our annual Valentine's Day event, Spark Your Heart, which was very successful. We have 2 weeks of Spark Sessions remaining for our winter semester programming. For the remainder of the year, we're looking forward to Winter Closing Ceremonies, to celebrate all the hard work our Execs and TLs have put in this year, and the achievements of first years who came out to Spark Sessions this semester.

Events, Projects, & Activities

General Service Usage

Attendance has generally been high at Winter Sessions, with every Session time having turnout from first years. Multiple first years have provided feedback and expressed to their TLs that they've really enjoyed the Sessions themes this semester!

Projects & Events: Spark Your Heart (Complete)

- Spark Your Heart (Spark's annual Valentine's Day event) took place on February 15th.
- The event was a success! Many TLs and Execs came out to help, which made the event very lively and exciting for attendees.
- Attendees participated in activities such as board games, cookie decorating, pin making (thanks to OPIRG McMaster for lending us their pin maker), snacks, and candy gram making.

Projects & Events: Roommate Matching Survey—SWHAT x Spark (Complete)

 We released a survey to match students with potential roommates for offcampus housing based on similar living preferences at SWHAT and Spark's Housing Hinge event in mid-January. Since the survey did not

- receive many responses at the time of the event, we decided to promote the survey separately at the beginning of March.
- The survey QR code was posted on our Instagram account, campus screens, and sent to off-campus Hamilton housing Instagram accounts to repost.
- This initiative was a big success! We received 40 responses (4x increase from January after launching the post).
- Survey results with students' top matches are currently being sent out, which will hopefully help students find roommates to live with in the coming year!

Projects & Events: Winter Sessions (Ongoing)

- Winter Sessions have been running smoothly this semester. The Sessions themes seem to be quite popular amongst first year students, with some favourites being resume and cover letter writing, and tackling imposter syndrome.
- Our final two Sessions to wrap up the year are our cooking/food & nutrition session (in collaboration with FCC), and Discover Your City (where TLs take Sparklings to explore Westdale), which everyone is looking forward to!

Projects & Events: Winter Publication (Upcoming)

- Like last semester, Spark releases a Winter publication on social media to provide information to first years on a topic that could help them out as they continue university.
- In line with one of the most popular winter sessions, cooking/food & nutrition, this semester's publication will display some easy recipes that first years can create in their residence rooms/off-campus houses.
- The date of publication release should be at the beginning of April.

Projects & Events: Winter Closing Ceremonies (Upcoming)

- Winter Closing Ceremonies, taking place on April 3rd, is Spark's way of wrapping up the year and looking back at all the team has accomplished.
- We'll be providing dinner for Execs, TLs, and Sparklings who attend, giving out appreciation gifts to TLs, handing out Spark Star awards to Sparklings who have attended at least 6 out of 8 Winter Sessions, and announcing the winners of the Spark Achievement in Leadership Scholarship.

Projects & Events: Spark Ambassadors Event (Upcoming)

- The Spark Ambassadors are first years registered in Spark's mentorship program that shadow Exec roles. This month, they've been planning Spark's final event of the year.
- The Ambassadors have been very engaged and are contributing many ideas that we are hoping to implement.
- The details of the event are still TBD, but it will take place in early April.


Summary


