GOALS

Objective 1	Advocate on quality student housing and the expansion of the Landlord Licensing Pilot Project
Description	Every year, more students move to Hamilton for post- secondary education and are unable to find safe, quality, and affordable student housing. The municipal affairs committee plans on advocating on behalf of student to expand the availability of quality and affordable student housing, as well as the expansion of the Landlord Licensing Pilot Project which is set to expire.
Benefits	Hamilton will be able to accommodate more students in safe, affordable, and quality housing– improving the McMaster student experience overall.
Difficulties	City Councillors are not always willing to collaborate or advocate on behalf of students.
Long-Term Implications	The Licensing Pilot Project can be put into place permanently to protect student renters indefinitely.
How?	We will listen to student consultations and collaborate with other post-secondary institutions and the city to bring our concerns and priorities forward.
Partners	VP Education, Mohawk, Redeemer, Underground, students, City of Hamilton, City Councillors

Objective 2	Build partner relationships with other post-secondary institutions and local organizations/associations in Hamilton to improve municipal advocacy
Description	There is a bit of a disconnect between student groups and post-secondary institutions across Hamilton. This prevents collaboration and sharing of insights that can benefit all parties.
Benefits	We can learn from other student unions while sharing what we've learned to collaborate on municipal advocacy.
Difficulties	Different student unions have different priorities and aren't able to contribute the same time and resources.

Long-Term Implications	This will hopefully set up future years for collaboration and promote a united front when advocated with other groups.
How?	Connect with other student unions to meet regularly and discuss collaborative projects as well as staying connected with local organizations and associations.
Partners	Mohawk, Redeemer, VP Education, local associations, City of Hamilton

Objective 3	Advocate on transit, lighting, and other municipal priorities as determined through student and committee input
Description	Student needs change year to year but some priorities have been ongoing in recent times. This year, transit is a large priority between real-time HSR tracking, improved and expanded bike lanes around campus, and the implementation of SOBI memberships. Lighting around campus is also of concern and a continued point of advocacy. Further priorities will be determined through student consultation, such as via the Your City survey.
Benefits	Advocate for student needs and improve the student experience.
Difficulties	Advocacy towards the City is not always met receptively and may take many years to see effects come into play.
Long-Term Implications	Hopefully successful advocacy will impact students for generation to come, whether through bike lanes or HSR improvements.
How?	This will likely be collaborative among local organizations and student groups towards city councillors. We will advocate during municipal engagement week and during pre-budget submission season via our written submission and in-person meetings.
Partners	VP Education, Mohawk, Redeemer, City Councillors, students

_	Promote municipal engagement among the student body
	through the Explore Hamilton campaign

Description	The Explore Hamilton campaign began last year as a way of introducing students to their municipality. This year, the campaign reflected more student input and relevant information on the local businesses and attractions that were included. We also hope to involve the Silhouette in filming local attractions to bring more attention to them.
Benefits	Promote local attractions and introduce students to areas across Hamilton.
Difficulties	We may not be able to reach all students and represent all spots in Hamilton.
Long-Term Implications	We hope to introduce students to their municipality so they are more motivated to stay in Hamilton and recontribute to our local economy.
How?	Work with the committee and other partners to bring the campaign to life and distribute guides during Clubsfest and other events.
Partners	VP Education, Underground, Silhouette, local attractions

Objective 5	Conduct Municipal Engagement Week to meet with city councillors and local stakeholders on advocacy priorities
Description	Typically, engagement weeks are conducted at the provincial and federal levels. We hope to conduct a municipal engagement week this year to meet with city councillors and local stakeholders to advocate on behalf of students.
Benefits	Build relationships with city councillors and advocate on behalf of students.
Difficulties	Connecting with city councillors may be difficult.
Long-Term Implications	This will hopefully set a precedent for future years.
How?	Partner with other student unions and reach out to city councillors.
Partners	VP Education, Mohawk, Redeemer, City Councillors, students

Objective 6	Collaborate and submit a pre-budget submission that aligns with student priorities
Description	Every year, a pre-budget submission is submitted to the city which follows or precedes meetings with city councillors.
Benefits	Connect with city councillors and advocate for students.
Difficulties	City councillors are not always receptive.
Long-Term Implications	Establish precedent of our credibility and reliability among city councillors.
How?	Collaborate with student unions and our students to deliver 2 pre-budget submissions.
Partners	VP Education, Mohawk, Redeemer, City Councillors, students

Objective 7	Deliver and report on the Your City Survey to collect student input on municipal advocacy
Description	Every few years a Your City Survey is conducted to gain input on student perspectives living in Hamilton. This helps inform our advocacy and better represent students.
Benefits	Inform our advocacy and represent students.
Difficulties	First survey being conducted in a while and may struggle reaching students.
Long-Term Implications	Data can be compared to previous and future years to inform continued advocacy.
How?	Craft new questions and formats to deliver to students with incentives for completing it.
