Priority: Housing

- <u>Recommendation:</u> Establish landlord licensing program permanently in all wards...
- Affordability and availability, not enough housing for students around campuses, expanding outwards
- Very tied to transit, transit allows students to live further from campus
- Student-oriented apartment-style homes are more common but less well-known/in demand, commute is longer, safety and security are concerns
- Deserted buildings and lots that are left empty (can be used for housing), i.e. near Innovation Park
- Fix shortage by leveraging those deserted places, linking transit, and build up
- Empty homes and buildings due to developers with financial issues/priorities
- Landlord accountability, lack of avenues to address, lack of tenant rights awareness, pushing penalties for landlords
- <u>Recommendation:</u> develop **reporting system** for landlord abuses, accessible, easy to navigate, **hotline for consultation** (already exists in the city) to empower tenants to speak up
- Lots of "small" illegal things that tenants deem "not worth" reporting, acting in fear of denying lease renewal or rent increase
- <u>Recommendation:</u> Bylaw for heating limit of 26 degree (ACORN), cooling bylaw already exists
- <u>Recommendation:</u> Bylaws/regulations for turnaround time for fixing AC/heating and associated costs
 - Moulton, Bates, Matthew, Wallingford
- Goal is to prevent landlords from taking action tenants
- Goal is to empower students to advocating for their tenant rights

• Priority: Transit

- Bike lanes
 - McMaster
 - Westdale
 - Main Street
 - Have to bike on sidewalk
 - Faster speed limits
 - James Street
 - Ainslie Wood is a good model
 - King St (connected to university and connected to Westdale)
 - 10 Bay, Nations, and campuses in downtown
- Remove access to motor vehicle required to apply to Hamilton/Ontario jobs
- HSR reliability
 - Running more frequently (1, 5, 10, and 51)
 - Buses going past stops when full
 - Increased student population year to year
 - More buses specifically between McMaster and bus hub (more affordable option)
 - Real-time tracking
 - Not for submission, advocacy to HSR
 - Encourage Transit, partnership?
 - Can't call tracking number
- PMTSA
 - Research if it's worth it to include with current timelines of LRT (may drown out other priorities)
